Board Bill No. 142

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Streets to temporarily close, barricade or otherwise impede the flow of traffic on East Gano Avenue by blocking said traffic flow at the north curb line of Blair Avenue, and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 300 (Committee Substitute)

An ordinance prohibiting the issuance of any package or drink liquor licenses for any currently non-licensed premises within the boundaries of the Twentieth Ward, as said boundaries are currently defined in Ordinance 62476, for a period of three years from the effective date hereof; containing an exception allowing, during the moratorium period, for the transfer of existing licenses, under certain circumstances; and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 272 (Floor Substitute)

An ordinance affirming that an area known as the 4324 and 4472 Delor Street as a blighted area.

Board Bill No. 271 (Floor Substitute)

An ordinance finding that a blighted area exists in the City known as the Gravois/Morganford Area.

Board Bill No. 299 (Committee Substitute)

An ordinance relating to cable television; recommended by the Board of Public Service; amending Ordinance 59197, as amended by Ordinances 64436, 64770, and 64911; extending the expiration date of the term of the cable television franchises granted by Ordinance 59197 for certain areas in the City from March 9, 2001, until _____, 2001 thereby facilitating the process for renewing or amending such cable television franchises; and extending the deadline for response to the Request for Renewal Proposal for Cable Television Franchise previously issued pursuant to Ordinance 64882 until _____, 2001.

Board Bill No. 253

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to submit all necessary applications and to enter into agreements with the U.S. Department of Justice or any other federal agency for the FY 2000 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program and authorizing the Mayor, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend any funds received by said grants to fulfill the obligations of the grant, and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 211

An ordinance establishing and creating a community unit plan for an area located in the City of St. Louis and comprising a portion of the Washington University Campus.

Board Bill No. 230

An ordinance finding that a blighted area exists in the City known as the Hyde Park Scattered Sites III Area.

Board Bill No. 246

An ordinance finding that a certain blighted area as defined in Section 99.320 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, 1994, as amended, (the "Statute" being Sections 99.300 to 99.715 inclusive), exists in the City of St. Louis ("City") and containing a description of the boundaries of said blighted area, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A", known as the Penrose/Greater Ville/O'Fallon Area ("Area"); finding that redevelopment and rehabilitation of the Area is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the people of the City; approving the Plan dated October 19, 2000 or the Area ("Plan"), incorporated herein by attached Exhibit "B", pursuant to Section 99.430; finding that there is a feasible financial plan for the development of the Area which affords maximum opportunity for development of the Area by private enterprise;

finding that no property in the Area may be acquired by the Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority of the City of St. Louis ("LCRA") through the exercise of eminent domain; finding that the property within the Area is partly occupied and the Redeveloper shall be responsible for relocating any eligible occupants displaced as a result of implementation of the Plan; finding that financial aid may be necessary to enable the Area to be redeveloped in accordance with the Plan; finding that there shall be available ten (10) year real estate tax abatement; and pledging cooperation of the Board of Aldermen and requesting various officials, departments, boards and agencies of the City to cooperate and to exercise their respective powers in a manner consistent with the Plan.

WHEREAS, Section Nine of said ordinance provides, in part, that no revenues in said Neighborhood Parks Capital Improvements Account shall be appropriated in the City's annual budget ordinance until and unless the Parks and Environmental Matters Committee of the Board of Aldermen (the "Parks Committee") approves by

resolution the recommendations of the Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry (the "Director") to the City's Budget Division for said Neighborhood Parks Capital Improvements Account annual budget appropriation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said ordinance the Director has forwarded his said recommendations to the Chair of the Parks Committee;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to Ordinance 64994, the Parks and Environmental Matters Committee does this 13th day of February 2001, hereby approve the recommendations of the Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry for the appropriation of Neighborhood Parks Capital Improvements Account funds for Fiscal Year 2002 attached hereto as Exhibit A, dated February 12, 2001, which is incorporated herein and made a part of this resolution by this reference; and

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Comptroller and Communications Commissioner to enter into and execute, on behalf of the City, a Right-of-Way Use Agreement ("Agreement") between The City of St. Louis ("the City") and Metricom, Inc., ("Metricom") pursuant to which Metricom, for the purposes of operating Ricochet®, a wireless digital communications microcellular network, will locate, place, attach, install, operate and maintain radio equipment within the City's right-of-way on terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement, attached hereto, marked Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference.

**Board Bill No. 62
(Committee Substitute)**

An ordinance pertaining to the real property records maintained by the Office of the Assessor; amending Section Two of Ordinance 60506 to require every Certificate of Value filed with the Office of the Assessor to contain the street address of the principal place of residence for every grantee; requiring every owner of real property within the City of St. Louis to file with the Office of the Assessor, on a form to be provided by the Assessor, such person's name and the street address of such person's residence; further requiring every partnership, corporation or

other business entity which is liable for the payment of property tax within the City of St. Louis to file with the Office of the Assessor the name of at least one officer or shareholder of such partnership, corporation or other business entity and the street address of such person's principal place of residence; prohibiting the use of a post office box as a residential street address and containing exceptions and a penalty clause.

Board Bill No. 285

An Ordinance, recommended and approved by the Airport Commission and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorizing a supplemental appropriation and set apart in the total amount of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) from the Airport Contingency Fund established under Ordinance 59286 approved October 26, 1984, to the "Annual Budget" established under authority of Ordinance No.64933 approved June 16, 2000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000 and ending June 30, 2001, for current expenses of the government as detailed in **EXHIBIT "1"** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and containing an emergency clause.
