I wish to report that on the 2nd day of November 2001, I delivered to the Office of the Mayor of the City of St. Louis the following board bills that were truly agreed to and finally adopted.

Board Bill No. 192

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor and the Court Administrator, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Program for a grant to fund: (1) a cost-benefit study of an experimental group, a control group, and a group of clients who are terminated from the program; (2) an evaluation of a young person's track that primarily includes African-American males 17 to 22 years of age; and (3) an assessment of the management information system, appropriating said funds and authorizing the Mayor and the Court Administrator, on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds by entering into contracts or otherwise for grant purpose and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 216

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to submit all necessary applications and to enter into agreements with the United States Department of Justice or any other federal agency for the FY 2001 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program and authorizing the Mayor, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend any funds received by such grants to fulfill the obligations of the grants, and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 171

An ordinance to amend Ordinance 65026, which pertains to the sale of real estate by the City of St. Louis to The Jones Company Custom Homes, Inc. for certain City owned real estate located at 14845 Olive Blvd. in St. Louis County, authorizing the Mayor and the Comptroller to exercise an extension of time for the sale of said real estate until March 24, 2002, and containing an emergency clause.

The Committee on Transportation & Commerce to whom was referred the following Board Bills, report that they have considered the same and recommend adoption.

Board Bill No. 193

An Ordinance, recommended and approved by the Airport Commission and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the City of St. Louis (the "City"), amending Section One of Ordinance No. 65240 approved July 18, 2001, increasing the maximum federal obligation in regard to that certain "Grant Agreement" offered by the United States of America acting through the Federal Aviation Administration of the United States Department of Transportation for Project Number 3-29-0085-59, Contract Number DTFA 09-01-A-40019, dated May 7, 2001, to reimburse for land acquired in fee for noise mitigation as shown on Exhibit A entitled "Parcel Listing" to the Grant Agreement, which is filed in the Office of the City Register, and adopted and ratified by the City under Ordinance No. 65240 approved July 18, 2001; and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 194

An Ordinance, recommended and approved by the Airport Commission and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, ratifying and adopting the actions of the Mayor and the Comptroller in accepting and executing on behalf of the City of St. Louis a certain grant agreement offered by the United States of America (the "Grant Agreement"), acting through the Federal Aviation Administration of the United States Department of Transportation, the Grant Agreement being for Project Number 3-29-0085-64, Contract Number DTFA 09-01-A-40063, dated August 17, 2001, for a maximum federal obligation of One Million Three Hundred Thirty Three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Three Dollars (\$1,333,333), which is filed in the Office of the City Register, for the environmental analysis of the proposed midfield terminal and the Runway 12C-30C extension and associate improvements; and containing and emergency clause.

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the 20 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 2313 extending westwardly from 20th Street 348 feet ± 4 feet to a point, same being bounded by Mullanphy, 20th, Cass and 22nd Street in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 208

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the remaining eastern 220 foot portion of the 20 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 2320 as bounded by Howard, 20th, Mullanphy, and 22nd Street in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 209

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the 20 foot wide north/south alley and the 15 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 2311 as bounded by Mullanphy, Hogan, Cass and 19th Street in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 213

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the 20 foot wide north/south alley in City Block 3404 as bounded by Adelaide, Second, Withers, and McKissock in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 222

An ordinance pertaining to traffic violations; providing that any person found guilty of a moving violation within a "construction zone" or "work zone" as defined herein shall be assessed a fine of not less than Fifty (\$50) dollars nor more than Two Hundred and Fifty (\$250) dollars in addition to any other fine authorized to be imposed by law; containing definitions and an emergency clause.
