Mr. Schmid invoked Aldermanic Rule 47 and submitted the following letter to the Clerk explaining his vote on the perfection of Board Bill No. 122 (Floor Substitute).

**EXPLANATION OF VOTE  
REGARDING FLOOR SUBSTITUTE  
FOR BOARD BILL NO. 122  
ACCORDING TO RULE 47 OF THE  
ST. LOUIS BOARD OF ALDERMEN**

On July 9, I gave an extensive (some say impassioned) presentation before the Legislation Committee concerning why it should not recommend passage of Board Bill 122 (the redistricting bill). I also sent signals to Mayor Slay concerning why I believed the map at that time could be disruptive to his neighborhood agenda and how it could seriously retard or prevent our town from becoming a truly great City again. I proposed an amendment on the floor of the Board of Aldermen that would have prevented moving the location of the 10th Ward from southeast St. Louis to southwest St. Louis.

Obviously, since July many things have changed. Now the Floor Substitute for Board Bill #122 has been promoted as the Mayor's bill. It has also been reported that the State Democratic Party may have supported the development of this latest redistricting map. The tragedy of September 11, has affected the entire country as well.

I still do not believe this map is appropriate. The architects of this latest map patently appear to attempt to address the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 42 U.S.C. §1973, to an extreme that race predominates to the exclusion of other critical legal precepts such as the "compact and contiguous" and "communities of interest" requirements. I

believe this map most likely fails to satisfy the U.S. Supreme Court determinations of Shaw v. Reno, 509 U.S. 630 (1993) and Miller v. Johnson, 515 U.S. 900 (1995). The shapes and relationships of the proposed 9th and 20th wards as well as the shifting of the 10th Ward location, for example, are so bizarre that they can only be understood as segregating voters on the basis of race -- with race predominating to the exclusion of other necessary concerns. Institutions and centers of commerce/culture/community that have a direct bearing on the future of the community have been excised from the proposed 20th ward.

However, perhaps these concerns now are best raised by others in a courtroom forum, rather than here at the Board of Aldermen. This map appears to have sufficient support to pass, and barring court challenge, will be our new ward boundary map. With the increasing clamor for Home Rule and City Charter change it may not survive until the next census, whether or not a court challenge is mounted.

My vote today is no longer directed at sending a message to Mayor Slay to open up the discussion, to improve the dialogue, to become involved in this process and to reject the map. He already rejected the last map and clearly supports the current Floor Substitute for Board Bill 122. It is now too late to unite behind another board bill and to enact another map. Now is the time to make the best of the situation and to continue working together to revitalize our neighborhoods.

My goal as a public servant, including in this redistricting vote, has always been to achieve what is in the best interest of my constituents in the 10th Ward -- where my family and I live. And, I have tried to be a team player, as a Democrat. My vote is not about me or about becoming a hero for some cause. I want my vote always to count for what will be most helpful for the area that I have been elected to represent.

Mayor Slay has committed his administration to the goals of making this a great City again and to improving the quality of life in our neighborhoods. In recent months he has demonstrated his intent to revitalize our 10th ward neighborhoods by deeds, not just by words. I believe he is sincere. I also believe there are other ways to draw the redistricting map that would be less disruptive to our neighborhood efforts and which would be a more direct route to improving our quality of life. Nevertheless, I am confident that the Mayor understands that he will be implementing his neighborhood improvement strategies in the context of this new map, which he supports. The future of the neighborhoods

in the current 10th Ward, whether designated in the new 20th or 9th wards will greatly determine the success of making southeast St. Louis great again and will likely also help to determine whether we can make the entire City of St. Louis great again.

Although I am disappointed with the Floor Substitute for Board Bill 122, I want to continue to work with this administration to improve the quality of life in all of our neighborhoods, especially within the boundaries of the ward in which I live.
