Board Bill No. 12

An ordinance recommended by the Convention and Tourism Bureau appropriating Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) from Fund 1111, The Convention and Tourism Fund, for the purpose of providing funds to Grand Center Inc. in order to subsidize the operations of Grandel Theatre permitting Grandel Theatre to limit the rent that it charges non-profit groups, making it possible for such groups to perform in a professional setting, and containing an emergency clause.

An ordinance approving a Redevelopment Plan for the 1914-26 Salisbury Street and 1915-21 Mallinckrodt Street Area ("Area") after finding that the Area is blighted as defined in Section 99.320 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, 1994, as amended, (the "Statute" being Sections 99.300 to 99.715 inclusive), containing a description of the boundaries of said Area in the City of St. Louis ("City"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A", finding that redevelopment and rehabilitation of the Area is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the people of the City; approving the Plan dated February 19, 2002 for the Area ("Plan"), incorporated herein by attached Exhibit "B", pursuant to Section 99.430; finding that there is a feasible financial plan for the development of the Area
