REPORT OF CITY OFFICIALS Report of the Clerk of the Board of Aldermen

To the President of the Board of
Aldermen:

I wish to report that on the 4th day of October 2002, I delivered to the Office of the Mayor of the City of St. Louis the following board bills that were truly agreed to and finally adopted.

Board Bill No. 166

An Ordinance for regulation and control of air pollution within the City of St. Louis: repealing ordinances 64749, approved November 5, 1999; and Ordinance 65108, approved December 20, 2000; and Ordinance 65448, approved April 21, 2002; pertaining to the regulation and control of air pollution and enacting in lieu thereof a new ordinance pertaining to the same subject matter, and containing a severability clause, a penalty clause and an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 167

An Ordinance pertaining to asbestos inspectors and asbestos abatement contractors, repealing Ordinance 65442 requiring both asbestos inspectors and asbestos abatement contractors to obtain permits, providing for suspensions and revocations of said permits, providing for appeals from suspensions and revocations, and enacting in lieu thereof a new ordinance pertaining to the same subject matter and containing a penalty clause and an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 213

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Health and Hospitals, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with the Missouri Department of Health for a grant to fund Regional Public Health Emergency Planning and Preparedness, appropriating said funds and authorizing the Director of Health and Hospitals on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds by entering into contracts or otherwise for grant purpose and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 233

An ordinance, recommended and approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, ratifying and adopting the actions of the Mayor and the Comptroller in accepting and executing on behalf of the City of St. Louis a certain grant agreement (the "Grant Agreement") offered by the United States of America, acting through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Grant Agreement being offered pursuant to a Federal Fiscal Year 2001 Notice of Funding Availability (the "NOFA") for the Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control in Privately-Owned Housing Grant Program (the "LBP Grant Program") for a maximum federal obligation of Three Million Dollars

(\$3,000,000); appropriating the sum of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) which will be made available pursuant to the Grant Agreement for expenditure for the purposes outlined herein; authorizing and directing the Director of Community Development Administration ("CDA") and the Director of Health and Hospitals to contract with municipal agencies and departments, non-profit corporations and other entities, as necessary, for the expenditure of the LBP Grant Program Funds; authorizing and directing the Comptroller to issue warrants thereon upon the City Treasury; and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 26

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Street Commissioner to take all necessary actions to honorarily designate Clemens Avenue as "William L. Clay, Sr. Drive".

Board Bill No. 222

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Wyoming Street from Broadway to Ninth in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 223

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Seventh from Arsenal to Wyoming in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 224

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Dorcas Street from Broadway to Busch Place in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 225

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Second Street from Dorcas to Lynch in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 226

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Ninth Street from Lynch southwardly – 707.5 feet ± 12.5 feet to terminus in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 227

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Busch Place from Arsenal to Lynch in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 232

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the 20 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 998 bounded by Stoddard, Leffingwell, Cole, Martin Luther King Dr., and Glasgow in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 234

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on Evans Avenue from Dr. Martin Luther King Drive to Spring Avenue and the 15 foot wide "T"-shaped alley in City Block 1862 as bounded by Evans, Grand, Page and Spring in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 235

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to amend Section One of Ordinance 65392, dated January 3, 2002 by revising the legal description of 1) An irregular portion of Prescott from Pitzman to Morin; 2) 298 foot portion of Morin west of Prescott; 3) 384 foot portion of Campbell west of Prescott; 4) 20 foot wide north/south alley in City Block 3495 as bounded by Campbell, Prescott, Morin, and Broadway; and 5) 20 foot wide north/south alley in City Block 3480 beginning at Morin and extending southwardly 150.15 feet ± feet to a point in the City of St. Louis, MO, as hereinafter described.

Board Bill No. 236

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to amend Section One of Ordinance 65389, dated January 3, 2002 by revising the legal description of Hall Street from Angelica to Bremen and the 356 foot portion of the north/south alley in City Block 1224 as bounded by Bremen, Second, Angelica, and First in the City of St. Louis, MO, as hereinafter described.

the Revised Statutes of Missouri, 2000, as amended, ("R.S.MO."); Sections 99.320 to 99.715 R.S.MO. inclusive, being hereinafter referred to as the "Statute"); containing a description of the boundaries of said area in the City of St. Louis, Missouri ("City"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A"; finding that redevelopment of the area is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the people of the City; approving the Redevelopment Plan dated September 24, 2002 for the area (The "Plan") pursuant to Section 99.430 of the statute, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B"; finding that the Plan is feasible; finding that the Plan is in conformity with the general plan for the development of the community as a whole; finding that any property in the area may be acquired by the Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority of the City of St. Louis ("LCRA") through the exercise of eminent domain or otherwise; finding that the property within the area is currently partially occupied and that the Redeveloper shall be responsible for relocating any eligible occupants displaced as a result of implementation of the Plan; finding that certain public works are necessary to enable the area to be redeveloped in accordance with the Plan; authorizing the design and installation of such necessary public works by the City; directing the Board of Public Service to let contracts, acquire real property interests, enter into agreements with the LCRA, the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission, Federal Highway Administration, Utilities, Bi-State Development Agency, and other governmental agencies, and provide for the design, construction and installation of the Public Works as set forth herein; establishing the City South Downtown Project Area Fund; containing sections for description of the public works, material guarantees, and estimated expenditure allocation; finding that there shall be available up to twenty-five (25) years of real estate tax abatement; pledging cooperation of the Board of Alderman and requesting various officials, departments, boards and agencies of the City to cooperate and exercise their respective powers in a manner consistent with the Plan; containing a severability clause; and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT:

1. This Honorable Board of Aldermen hereby directs the 2002-03 Ways & Means Committee to hold a public hearing to consider enlarging the geographic boundaries of the East Loop Parkview Gardens Special Business District on _____, 2002 at 10:00 a.m. in the Leisure Room (#230), City Hall, Tucker and Market Streets.

2. The maximum boundaries of the East Loop Parkview Gardens Special Business District are commonly known as follows:

Beginning at the point of the west line of Ruth Porter Mall (City Park) and the north line of

a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 4548; thence westwardly along said north alley line and its westward prolongation diagonally across Goodfellow Boulevard to its point of intersection with the north line of a 20' wide east-west ally in City Block 4543; thence westwardly along said north alley line and its westward prolongation diagonally across Hamilton Boulevard to its point of intersection with the north line of a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 4542; thence westwardly along said north alley and its westward prolongation to its point of intersection with the northeastern right-of-way line of Metrolink; thence north-westwardly across the Metrolink right-of-way to a point of intersection of the northeastern right-of-way line of Metrolink and the north property line of property now, or formerly, owned by Bi-State Development Agency parcel number 48561301100; thence westwardly along said north property line and its westward prolongation to its point of intersection with the east line of Des Peres Avenue; thence north-westwardly along said east street line and its north-west prolongation to its point of intersection with the east line of Rosedale Avenue; thence north-westwardly along said east street line and its northwest prolongation to its point of intersection with the east line of Skinker Boulevard; thence north along the said east line to its point of intersection with the south line of Olive Street; thence westwardly along the said south street line to its point of intersection with the City Limits of the City of St. Louis; thence south-westwardly and southwardly along said City Limits to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' wide alley in City Block 5408; thence eastwardly along said south alley line and its eastward prolongation across Skinker Boulevard to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 5421; thence eastwardly along said south alley line and its eastward prolongation across Rosedale Avenue to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 5422; thence eastwardly along the said south alley line and its eastward prolongation across Des Peres Avenue and the Metrolink right-of-way to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 5512; thence eastwardly along said alley line and its eastward prolongation across DeGiverville Avenue to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' east-west alley in City Block 5514; thence eastwardly along said alley line to its point of intersection with the south line of a 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 5515; thence eastwardly along said south alley line and its eastward prolongation parallel to Delmar Boulevard across Laurel Avenue and through

City Block 5568 to its point of intersection with the west line of DeBaliviere Avenue(100" wide); thence northwardly along the west line of DeBaliviere Avenue and its northward prolongation across Delmar Boulevard to its point of intersection with the west line of the Ruth Porter Mall; thence northwardly along said west line of the Ruth Porter Mall and its northward prolongation across the 15' wide east-west alley in City Block 4548 to its point of intersection with the north line of said alley, the point of beginning.

3. The real estate tax rate to be levied shall not exceed eighty-five cents (\$.85) on one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation which shall be payable on or before December 31, and which shall be returned to the special business district by January 31 of the year following its collection.

4. The business license tax to be levied on all businesses within the District shall not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the business license tax imposed by the City of St. Louis.

5. All additional revenue shall be used to carry out any and all of the improvements allowed in Section 71.796, RSMo.

6. The special business district may also exercise the following powers:

a. To cooperate with other public agencies and with any industry or business located within the district in the implementation of any project within the district;

b. To enter into any agreement with any other public agency, and person, firm or corporation to effect any of the provisions contained in Sections 71.790-71.808 RSMo.;

c. To contract and be contracted with, and to sue and be sued;

d. To accept gifts, grants, loans, or contributions from the city in which the district is located, the United States of America, the State of Missouri, political subdivisions, foundations, other public or private agencies, individuals, partnerships, or corporations; and

e. To employ such managerial, engineering, legal, technical, clerical, accounting and other assistance as it may deem advisable. The district may also contract with independent contractors for any such assistance.

7. The City of St. Louis, Missouri shall not decrease the level of publicly funded services in the proposed special business district existing prior to the creation of the district or transfer the cost of providing services to the district unless these services are decreased throughout the City of St. Louis.

The City shall not discriminate in the provision of publicly funded services between areas included in the proposed district and other areas of the City.

Resolution No. 185

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, November 5, 2002, voters in the City of St. Louis and across the State of Missouri will be asked to entrust their vote, and their future, to one of two major candidates seeking to represent Missouri in the United States Senate; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of this Board that one of the candidates, former Representative Jim Talent, has an established record that is in direct conflict with the best interests of the residents of the City of St. Louis, including numerous issues of significant importance such as health care, economic development, prescription drugs, labor, Health Care in Underserved areas and Aid to Single Mothers; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Talent introduced the "Real Welfare Reform Act" in 1994, which cut off benefits to unwed mothers and reduced welfare spending by \$70 billion; and

WHEREAS, He explained that the children of these mothers would not be punished because he intended to give the money instead to states, who could use the funds to take care of the children, through the re-establishment of state-run orphanages. (Post-Dispatch, 6/18/94); and

WHEREAS, Talent justified this proposal by claiming that welfare was the cause of illegitimate births, which leading experts around the country decried as misguided and untrue. (Post-Dispatch, 5/17/94)

WHEREAS, Moderate Republicans, including then Sen. Majority Leader Bob Dole, quickly backed away from Talent's welfare proposal after the election of 1994, and Newt Gingrich ultimately abandoned the plan because of a lack of support. (Los Angeles Times, 12/2/94 and KC Star, 11/21/94)

WHEREAS, Mr. Talent has shown a lack of commitment to providing our community, our children and single parents across this nation with interim support, by voting against \$3 billion for a program to help welfare recipients find work (Education and Workforce vote on 6/12/97), voting against extending technical training allowance for persons moving from welfare to work.

(Education and Workforce vote on 11/3/99) and by his plan to bring back state-run orphanages.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis that we support the single parents requiring Aid in our community, and their right to have an opportunity to rebuild their lives and to raise their children, and develop new job skills free from the threat of state-run orphanages and that this Board stands squarely with our citizens in opposing Mr. Talent and his plan to bring back state-run orphanages all across our nation.

said ordinance (the "Expansion Area") and another area, as more fully described in said ordinance (the "Satellite Area") as an enterprise zone eligible for the tax incentives provided by the Statute; and

WHEREAS, the Statute allows, in certain circumstances and subject to certain conditions, the ad valorem taxes which would otherwise be due on subsequent improvements made in enterprise zone areas to be abated up to 100% for a period not to exceed 25 years from the date the original enterprise zone area was so designated; for any such subsequent improvements begun prior to August 28, 1991; and

WHEREAS, the Initial Area was designated as an enterprise zone in 1983 and the Expansion Area and Satellite Area have both been designated as an enterprise zone; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 62886 provides for abatement of taxes on real property in the Initial Area, Expansion Area and Satellite Area (hereinafter, together referred to as the "Areas") in accordance with the requirements of Section 135.215 of the Statute, as amended from time to time, subject to certain terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 62886 provides for the Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority of the City of St. Louis ("LCRA") to review plans for subsequent improvements on real property in the Areas and to recommend to this Board the extent to which tax abatement should be granted therefor; and

WHEREAS, Drew Wojcik Photography is renovating the building for a studio/gallery; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the subsequent improvements will cost approximately \$154,000; and will result in an increase of 2 new jobs; and

WHEREAS, LCRA has reviewed plans for its subsequent improvements and recommends that the ad valorem taxes that would otherwise be imposed on, subsequent improvements be abated fully for a period of ten (10) years; and

WHEREAS, Drew Wojcik Photography began the subsequent improvements after August 28, 1992; and

WHEREAS, Section 135.215 of the Statute provides that no abatement shall be granted except upon approval of an authorizing resolution by the governing authority having jurisdiction over the enterprise zone area following a public hearing held by said governing authority for the

purpose of obtaining the opinions and suggestions of residents of political subdivision in the area affected and published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area to be affected by the exemption at least twenty (20) days prior to the hearing but not more than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing, stating the time, location, date and purpose of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, such public hearing was held on the _____ day of _____, 2002, notice of which was given in accordance with the requirements of the Statutes as described above, and all interested parties had the opportunity to be heard at said public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the St. Louis Board of Aldermen as follows:

1. The Subsequent Improvements shall be fully exempt from the ad valorem taxes, which would otherwise be imposed thereon for a period of ten years.

3. In accordance with Section 135.215(1) of the Statute, a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Director of Missouri Department of Economic Development within thirty (30) days of its approval.
