FIRST READING OF BOARD BILLS

Board Members Young and Flowers introduced by request:

Board Bill No. 353

An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorizing and directing the Director of Airports and the Comptroller of the City of St. Louis (the “City”) to enter into and execute on behalf of the City the “First Amendment To The Lambert-St. Louis International Airport (the ‘Airport’) Concession Agreement (Shoe Shine)” (hereinafter referred to as the “First Amendment”) to the Airport Concession Agreement for Shoe Shine (AL-69) between the City and Airport Shoeshine Corporation, a corporation of the State of Missouri, dated July 16, 2001, and authorized by City Ordinance No. 65215, approved June 29, 2001 (the “Agreement”); the First Amendment to the Agreement, which is attached hereto as ATTACHMENT “1” and made a part hereof, was approved by the City’s Airport Commission, and its terms are more fully described in Section One of this Ordinance; providing that the provisions set forth in this Ordinance shall be applicable exclusively to the Agreement as amended by the First Amendment; containing a severability clause; and containing an emergency clause.

An ordinance approving a Redevelopment Plan for the 3620 French Avenue Area (“Area”) after finding that the Area is blighted as defined in Section 99.320 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, 2000, as amended, (the “Statute” being Sections 99.300 to 99.715 inclusive), containing a description of the boundaries of said Area in the City of St. Louis (“City”), attached hereto and

An Ordinance pertaining to the Employees Retirement System, amending Ordinance 64833, approved December 1999, as amended, by repealing Section Twelve (3), codified as Section 4.16.480 of the Revised Code of the City of St. Louis 1994, as amended, pertaining to unfunded accrued liability contributions-determination and enacting in lieu thereof a new Section Twelve (3), to be codified as Section 4.16.480 pertaining to the same subject matter but changing the amortization time to a rolling 30 year period, and containing an emergency clause.

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Health and Hospitals, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with The Missouri Circuit Court, Twenty-Second Judicial Circuit, St. Louis City Drug Court for a grant of \$59,891 to fund assessment/screening for infectious and communicable diseases on potential drug court participants, assess the overall medical needs of detainees, make referrals and monitor follow-up for on-going medical and support services to the Federally Qualified Health Centers participating in this program, appropriating said funds and authorizing the Director of Health and Hospitals on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds by entering into contracts or otherwise for grant purpose and containing an emergency clause.

Board Member Carter introduced by request:

Board Bill No. 363

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Health and Hospitals, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with the City of St. Louis Mental Health Board of Trustees for a grant of \$87,639 to fund Outreach service that will identify, engage, assess, and refer at risk men and women for substance abuse and/or HIV/AIDS from targeted neighborhoods to Substance abuse treatment and/or Federally Qualified Health Centers participating in this program to coordinate access to treatment services for highest risk clients, appropriating said funds and authorizing the Director of Health and Hospitals on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds by entering into contracts or otherwise for grant purpose and containing an emergency clause.

Board Member Flowers introduced by request:

Board Bill No. 364

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor and Comptroller of the City of St. Louis to execute, upon receipt of and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Ten Thousand Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$210,480.00) and other good and valuable consideration, a Quit Claim Deed to remise, release and forever quit-claim unto Metropolitan Park and Recreation District certain City-owned property located in Out Lot 121, which property is known as 10800 and 10800R Riverview Drive, containing 8.053 acres, more or less, and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 365

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel in a 10 foot wide public walk located in City Block 4583 beginning at Olive and continuing northwardly ? 152.395 feet to the 20 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 4583 as bounded by Washington, Whittier, Olive and Boyle in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Resolution No. 239

WHEREAS, the Section 8 Tenant-Based Assistance Program, administered by the St. Louis City and St. Louis County Housing Authorities, provides financial assistance to thousands of residents in the St. Louis Metropolitan region; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this federally funded program is to assist low income families in finding and maintaining affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, in recent years a successful effort has been made to stabilize and redevelop some of the older neighborhoods in the City of St. Louis by encouraging the building of market rate housing in order to attract more middle income residents back to the city; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of housing choice vouchers through the Section 8 Assistance Program and the ongoing effort to redevelop our neighborhoods must be coordinated in order to prevent the creation of neighborhoods in which low income families are clustered together; and

WHEREAS, permitting the creation of areas which are predominantly Section 8 families is detrimental to neighborhood revitalization and is contrary to the goal of the Section 8 program; and

WHEREAS, a review of the HUD regulations under which the voucher program is administered should be reviewed and revised in order to better promote the Section 8 Assistance Program mission and assist in the growth and development of our neighborhoods;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis, that we call upon the St. Louis City and St. Louis County Housing Authorities to review their procedure for the distribution of Section 8 vouchers to ensure that the recipients secure proper housing throughout the St. Louis area and or not clustered together in certain parts of the City and we further direct the Clerk of this Board to send a copy of this resolution to the executive director of both the St. Louis City and St. Louis County Housing Authorities; the members of the Missouri Congressional Delegation and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

LIVING WAGE REQUIREMENTS
