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
### About the data:

The P.L. 94-171 summaries (released by US Census Bureau, February 24, 2011) have population totals and summaries by race, Hispanic or Latino, and voting age for all appropriate geographic areas: state, counties or equivalent areas, state legislative districts, voting districts, county subdivisions, school districts, places, American Indian/Alaska Native/Native Hawaiian areas, census tracts, block groups, and blocks.

New for the 2010 Census, housing unit counts will be included as part of the 2010 Census Redistricting Data [P.L. 94-171] Summary Files. Also for 2010, states recommended including school districts as part of the geographic summary levels and a new table on housing unit occupancy status. More data will be released beginning in the summer/fall 2011.

All data aggregated from **Census blocks**.

**Census blocks**—smallest of census geographic areas, normally bounded by streets or other prominent physical features or by the boundaries of geographic areas. They may be as small as a typical city block that's bounded by four streets/alleys. Blocks are identified by a four-digit number, unique within census tracts for the 2010 Census. Nationally, blocks average about 100 people each.

**Citywide**








TOTAL POPULATION
