To the President of the Board of Aldermen:

I wish to report that on the 9th day of November, 2007, I delivered to the Office of the Mayor of the City of St. Louis the following board bills that was truly agreed to and finally adopted.

Board Bill No. 323

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate and abolish the public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on a tract of land being the easternmost 260 feet of a 16 feet wide East-West alley in City Block 3946, same bounded by Papin, Pacific, Chouteau, and Vandeventer in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 325

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Department of Health, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to accept a Grant Award from the Health Resources and Services Administration of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to fund a Minority AIDS Initiative Program, appropriating said funds in the amount of \$378,174.00 and authorizing the Department of Health on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds as permitted by the Grant Award, to enter into contracts or otherwise for grant purposes and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 334

An ordinance establishing a four way stop site at the intersection of Cherokee Street and Michigan Street by regulating all east-west traffic traveling on Cherokee Street approaching such intersection and containing an emergency clause.

(Committee Substitute)

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Street Commissioner to take all necessary actions to honorarily designate Walnut and 10th Streets and Clark and 10th Streets as "Judge Clyde S. Cahill Jr. Sq."

Board Bill No. 336
(Committee Substitute)

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Street Commissioner to take all necessary actions to honorarily designate 8th and Spruce Streets as "Stan the Man Musial Drive."

Board Bill No. 345
(Committee Substitute)

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Streets to close, barricade or otherwise impede the flow of traffic on the 5300 Block of Savoy Court by blocking said traffic flow at the west line of Union, the north line of Delmar and the east line of Savoy Court and containing an emergency clause.

Board Bill No. 350

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel in 1) Benton from the east right-of-way line of Elliott eastwardly 150 feet to the west right-of-way line of the 15 foot wide north/south alley in City Block 1901 (vacated) and City Block 2364 2) Elliott from the north right-of-way line of Benton southwardly 120 feet to a point in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

Board Bill No. 352

An ordinance directing the Director of Streets to temporarily close, barricade, or otherwise impede the flow of traffic at the north/south alley in City Block 6120 approximately 130 feet south of the south curb line of Lillian Avenue.

Board Members President Reed and Flowers introduced by request:

Board Bill No. 378

An ordinance pertaining to the tethering, confinement and treatment of dogs and cats, amending Ordinance 66384, approved July 31, 2004, by repealing Section 10.04.010 of SECTION 65206 of said Ordinance pertaining to the definitions and enacting in lieu thereof a new section pertaining to the same subject matter; also repealing Section 10.04.285 of SECTION 65206 of said Ordinance pertaining to enforcement of this provision and enacting in lieu thereof a new section on the same subject matter; and containing an emergency clause.

Redmond Writers Club (chartered in 1986 by Sherman Fowler, Darlene Roy & Mr. Redmond) and SIUE; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Redmond has the distinction of being Poet Laureate of East Saint

Louis since 1976 and the Founding Editor of Drumvoices Revue. During the early-mid 1960's, he edited SIUE's Alestle & the East St. Louis Monitor under the late Clyde C. Jordan. He "souljourned" to The March on Washington. He published poems in St. Louis-area journals—Perspectives, Free Lance & Tambourine. He was cited by the Chicago Tribune as one of 25 outstanding college students in America. He won poetry awards sponsored by Washington University's Annual Fine Arts Festival & Free Lance magazine. He wrote proposals for the Human Development Corporation; and

WHEREAS, during the mid-late 1960's, he became a leader in Civil Rights/Black Power movements & regional/national literary circles. He was Director of Head Start at Grace Hill Settlement House. His other accomplishments included Teacher-Counselor & Poet-in-Residence at SIU-East Louis' Experiment in Higher Education; a teacher with Henry Dumas, Oliver Jackson, & Katherine Dunham at the Performing Arts Training Center; anthologized in The New Black Poetry and Nigeria's Black Orpheus; a performer with Black Artists Group (BAG) in Laclede Town & Lafayette Park; a teacher in Webster University's Upward Bound Program & Writer-in-Residence at Oberlin College (Ohio); and

WHEREAS, from 1970-85, Mr. Redmond was Professor of English and Poet-in-Residence in Ethnic Studies at California State University-Sacramento; won an Outstanding Faculty Research Award & a National Endowment for the Arts Creative Writing Fellowship; published Drumvoices: The Mission of Afro-American Poetry plus Sentry of the Four Golden Pillars, River of Bones and Flesh and Blood, & Songs from an Afro-Phone; edited Sides of the River & Griefs of Joy: Anthology of Afro-American Poetry for Students, recorded an LP/CD, Bloodlinks & Sacred Places, and became Visiting Professor at University of Wisconsin-Madison; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, he rejoined the faculty of SIUE; in 1998, he was invited by Oprah Winfrey to read an original poem at Maya Angelou's 70th birthday gala; in 1999, he joined Maya Angelou, Toni Morrison, Walter Mosley, Lerone Bennett Jr., August Wilson & Henry Dumas as an inductee into the International Hall of Fame for Writers of African Descent; in 2003, received Staying the Course Award with Angela Bassett and Gordon Parks in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Redmond experienced the fruits of his photographic labors in 2004 when "Visualizing Black Writers: An Extra-Literary Exhibit from the Eugene B. Redmond

Collection" received international premieres at SIUE's Morris University Center Gallery & the African Studies Institute Gallery at the University of Ibadan in Nigeria; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Redmond has authored or edited dozens of collections of poetry & diverse writings, including plays for stage and TV, and the posthumously published works of Dumas; received a Lifetime Achievement Award from Pan-African Movement USA, a National Endowment for the Humanities Grant, a Pushcart Prize: Best of the Small Presses, a Tribute to Elder Honor from the African Poetry Theater of NYC, an American Book Award for The Eye in the Ceiling, and released Blues-Ode to the ForeDreamers & Other Poems in 2001; and
